- 5: Mold found inside the ice machine on the fourth floor.
- 5: Mildew found inside the ice machine on the fifth floor.
- 6: Ice bucket is not clean. It is found in room 415.
- 7: Water leaking from the pipe above sink in housekeeping room.
- *9: Dead ladybugs found on the window sill, air conditioning, and floor in room 515.
- 10: The side door on the west side of hotel has a gap between the door and the floor on the first floor.
- 14: Trash and debris on the west side of the hotel parking lot.
- *15: Spray bottles with chemicals stored near toilet paper and tissue on housekeeping cart.

- 23: Ceiling looked damaged underneath the overpass of the hotel.
- 24: Debris found on the floor on the third floor. The floors need to be vacuumed.
- 24: Trash bags filled with trash found near ice machine on fourth floor.
- 24: Food debris and other trash found on the fifth floor hallway.
- 24: Cigarette butts and trash found on the ground in east stairwell.
- 25: Strain of hair found in bathroom sink in room 315.
- 25: Shower has mold on the bottom corner in room 515.
- 25: Toilet is not flushing in room 229.
- 25: Mold found on the lower part of the shower of room 415.
- 28: No telephones in room 515.
- 29: Not enough lighting in bathroom of room 515.
- 30: Dust found on the vent in restroom of 515.
- 31: Dead insects found on window sill in room 515.
- 31: Window sill is dusty in room 229.
- 32: Two hangers found in room 205. Must have minimum of four hangers.
- 32: Used soap and shampoo found in room 515 bathroom.
- 33: Build up dust and drops of paint found on the bed post of room 429.
- 33: Hole found on the mattress in room 229.
- 33: Stains found on the sleeper sofa mattress.
- 33: Cigarette burns found on bed post in room 205.
- 34: Hole found on the sheets bed sheets in room 515. Strain of hair found on the bed.
- 34: Stain found on the bed skirt in room 415.
- 34: Food debris stain on the sheets in room 205.

What is Legionella?

Legionella are bacteria that can cause a serious lung infection called Legionnaires' disease. People can get sick when they inhale water droplets that contain the bacteria.



How does Legionella affect building water?

Legionella bacteria grow naturally in the environment and in water. They can also grow in building water systems. Buildings with large water systems, like hotels, may be more likely to grow Legionella. If the bacteria are present, they can be spread through aerosols produced by: hot and cold water systems, showerheads, decorative fountains, hot tubs, cooling towers, and more.



Why should you care?

Legionella may grow and spread in hotel water systems. Hotels often have a large number of visitors and numerous Legionella outbreaks have occurred at hotels. From 2016 to 2017, there were 134 illnesses related to two outbreaks at Tennessee hotels.



What can you do to prevent Legionella?

You can protect your guests and staff by assessing your water system and learning about water management programs. Using a water management program can help identify hazards in your water system and prevent the growth and spread of *Legionella* bacteria.
