7: Room 157: toilet not flushing properly.

- 14: Trash and debris around/throughout the property. Guests have placed their trash outside of their rooms which is not allowed.
- *18: Room 157: smoke detector not working.
- *20: Exits signs are not lit and emergency lights are not coming on in the lobby.
- 21: Restrooms in lobby area need attention. No toilet tissue present.
- 22: No soap, towels in either restroom.
- 23: Outside walls have dirt build-up and webs. Outside ceiling deteriorated .
- 25: Room 157: peeling paint in bathtub.
- 30: Room 157: vent cover is not present in the bathroom . You can see parts of the vent in the wall.
- 31: Paint splatter in several windows, broken window needs to be repaired.
- 32: Room 157: no hangers present
- 34: Room 157: stained pillow
- 35: Room 157: stained lamp shade, chair, peeling on tv console.
- 36: Floors in lobby area need to be swept and mopped. Floors not in good repair in laundry room.
- 37: Room 157: dirty walls

Stained Ceiling tile in lobby area and bathrooms.

- 38: Room 157: no closet rods present for guests
- 41: Laundry on the floor.

Additional Comments

Hotel is under renovations, several rooms on the property have been gutted. Room 157 was the only clean room available .

What is Legionella?

Legionella are bacteria that can cause a serious lung infection called Legionnaires' disease. People can get sick when they inhale water droplets that contain the bacteria.



How does Legionella affect building water?

Legionella bacteria grow naturally in the environment and in water. They can also grow in building water systems. Buildings with large water systems, like hotels, may be more likely to grow Legionella. If the bacteria are present, they can be spread through aerosols produced by: hot and cold water systems, showerheads, decorative fountains, hot tubs, cooling towers, and more.



Why should you care?

Legionella may grow and spread in hotel water systems. Hotels often have a large number of visitors and numerous Legionella outbreaks have occurred at hotels. From 2016 to 2017, there were 134 illnesses related to two outbreaks at Tennessee hotels.



What can you do to prevent Legionella?

You can protect your guests and staff by assessing your water system and learning about water management programs. Using a water management program can help identify hazards in your water system and prevent the growth and spread of *Legionella* bacteria.
